 - 1) reveal their progress against their ICPD commitments
 - 2) recognize the right of all young people to make decisions about their own sexual and reproductive health
- To build momentum for universal access to sexual and reproductive health services around the world
- To present a petition to the Secretary-General of the United Nations to put pressure on governments to deliver their ICPD commitments by 2015
